

**BYE-LAWS & REGULATIONS OF  
CARLTON CRICKET CLUB LIMITED**

February, 1987  
(As amended January, 1990)

**1.0 Application for Ordinary Membership.**

- 1.1 Every person wishing to become a member shall apply in writing to the council in such form as it may direct.
- 1.2 The names and addresses of applicants for membership shall be displayed on a list of applications for membership on the Notice Board of the Company in the Pavilion, Grange Loan, Edinburgh.
- 1.3 No person shall be admitted to membership until his name has been published on the list of applications for membership for at least seven consecutive days.
- 1.4 No person shall be admitted a member until fourteen days after the date of receipt of his application.
- 1.5 The Council may refuse to admit any person to membership without assigning any reason thereon.
- 1.6 Ordinary members must carry their Membership Cards (Fixture Cards) at all times when on the ground or premises at Grange Loan and produce the same when required.

**2.0 Honorary Members**

- 2.1 Members of teams contesting any cricket match on the Company's ground and the officials of the clubs to which these teams belong shall, while on the Company's premises in connection with such match, be deemed Honorary Members of the Company and with all the privileges of Ordinary Members except that they shall not be entitled to introduce guests. No person who has resigned his membership of the Company in response to a request made by the Council under Article 5.2 of the Article of Association of the Company or who has been expelled from membership may be an Honorary Member.

### **3.0 Guests**

- 3.1 Members shall be entitled to introduce guests to the Company's ground and facilities. No member may introduce more than four guests at a time, nor more than eight guests in any one period of seven days. The same person may not be introduced as a guest more than twice in any calendar month.
- 3.2 No guest may be supplied with alcoholic liquor unless on the invitation and in the company of a Ordinary Member or an Honorary Life Member and unless his name and address along with the name of the member and date has been inscribed in the visitors' book of the Company.

### **4.0 Sale of Alcohol**

- 4.1 No alcoholic liquor shall be sold or supplied to any person under the age of 18 years.
- 4.2 No alcoholic liquor shall be sold or supplied for consumption off the Company's premises except to an Ordinary Member or an Honorary Life Member, in person for consumption by him.

### **5.0 Subscriptions**

- 5.1 The re-entry to be paid by any member whose membership has ceased by reason of non-payment of subscription shall be nil in the case of non-playing members and in the case of playing members, shall be £5.00 where application for re-admission to membership is received within one month of the date of cessation and shall otherwise be £10.

### **6.0 Conduct of Members**

- 6.1 Any member playing in or spectating at any cricket match involving a team of the Company who conducts himself in a manner which in the opinion of the Council is likely to bring the Company or the game of cricket into disrepute, may be expelled from membership.
- 6.2 Any member of the Council may require any member and any guest who is drunk or who conducts himself in a disorderly manner to leave the Company's premises.

- 6.3 Any member who fails to leave the Company's premises when requested to do so by a member of the Council and the member who introduced any guest who fails to leave the Company's premises when requested to do so by a member of the Council, may be expelled from membership.
- 6.4 Members may exercise their dogs upon the ground at Grange Loan when matches are not in progress. Each member shall keep his or her dog under control at all times. Dogs must not be permitted to foul the ground. Any accidental fouling must be removed from the Ground.

## **7.0 Duties**

- 7.1 In order to provide for the carrying out of work necessary for the maintenance of the ground and pavilion and the organization and running of cricket matches and the premises and bar of the club, the Council may make directions to share the work amongst the members as shall seem equitable to them. Any member who persistently fails to carry out the duties allotted to him by the Council, may be expelled from membership.
