

Carlton Cricket Club

THE CARLTON CRICKET CLUB having attained its Fiftieth Birthday this year, it has been decided to hold a Fancy Fair and Carnival to celebrate the occasion in a fitting manner, and at the same time raise Funds to improve the Ground and carry on the Club in such a way as its reputation deserves. It is impossible to give anything like a retrospect of the Club's doings here, but those desirous of acquainting themselves with its history can still obtain the Booklet published in 1904, which describes minutely the career of the Club from its birth. On the opposite page will be found a list of the names of the Office-Bearers from 1863.

Among the important events that stand out prominently none are so interesting as the venture of 1872, when owing to the exertions of Mr Robert H. Christie, who was at that time Secretary, the Club engaged the United South of England XI., captained by Dr W. G. Grace, whose first appearance it was in Scotland. The Carlton, as well

as winning the game, netted over £100.

The Club has had many ups and downs, but it reached its high-water mark in 1900, when perhaps it could boast of the finest Club side that ever played together regularly in Edinburgh. No games were lost and the following were the averages:—

and sufficient money was raised to build a Pavilion and lay out the ground for cricket. From that time it has never looked back and no Club in Scotland can claim such a record, a minimum number of matches lost being the invariable rule and that without the aid of a Professional. Last year only 1 match was lost and 16 won; in 1909 1 match was lost and 20 won; in 1907 2 matches were lost out of 21 played. The Records and Averages for the three years mentioned are given to show the standard of excellence attained.

From these few notes enough can be gathered to show how the Cricket Club stands, but in connection with it a Golf Club was started and achieved fame by winning the first Dispatch Trophy outright and also won the

present Trophy in 1903.

In the year 1906 a Hockey Club was started by Dr Stevenson, and immediately quite a remarkable run of success was attained. In its first year it was second in the so-called championship, then won it outright without a single defeat in its second year. The two following years it was second, and in 1910-11, with no fewer than seven internationalists in its ranks, it again won the championship without defeat, scoring a record number of goals, 109 against 8. During this last season once more the championship was won without defeat, and this was all the more remarkable as eight of the previous year's champion XI. had left, so that with a new team the Club kept up the wonderful record. Nothing in the history of sport can exceed this. It may be interesting to note that the latest addition to the Club was inaugurated last year in the shape of a Ladies' Cricket Club, and it promises to rival the success of the parent body.




