

Welcome to Carlton Cricket Club!



We'd like to extend a warm welcome to you to Carlton Cricket Club. This note is a brief introduction to the club; there is lots more information on the [club website](#).

Our ground is at [Grange Loan, Edinburgh EH9 2EE](#). All training sessions take place there, and some home games. We have just one pitch, and 7 senior teams (not to mention about 15 junior ones), so many "Home" games have to be played elsewhere.

Our season runs from early April to the end of August. We also have indoor winter training sessions from January to March.

Training

Summer senior training sessions are led by our head coach, Dewald Nel.

Senior training	Tuesday 6:30 - 8:30pm
Senior training	Thursday 6:30 - 8:30pm
Women's training	Friday 6:00 - 8:00pm

All players are encouraged to attend training as often as possible. Players aspiring to play in the 1st or 2nd XI are expected to attend training twice a week, and should notify the head coach if they aren't able to attend a session.

Matches

Carlton enters 5 teams in the ESCA leagues. In 2023, our teams are in these divisions:

- 1st XI: ESCA Premiership
- 2nd XI: ESCA Championship
- 3rd XI: ESCA Division 2
- 4th XI: ESCA Division 4
- 5th XI: ESCA Division 7

We enter two Women's league teams:

- 1st XI: Women's Premier League
- 2nd XI: Women's Challenger League.

Both 1st XIs also enter various cup competitions.

League matches are on Saturday or Sunday; cup matches are on a Sunday (one-day), or Tuesday or Thursday (T20).

There are also occasional friendly midweek T20 matches throughout the season.

Social

We have a bar in the clubhouse which is open every Saturday during the cricket season from the middle of the afternoon. The bar is also sometimes open on Friday nights, Sunday afternoons and during midweek matches. There's a range of soft drinks, wines, beers, spirits and snacks on sale.

The club also hosts special social events - Pizza evenings run by Pizza Geeks, Quiz Nights, Curry Nights and our famous BBQs. Not only are the social events a great way to meet other club members but they raise valuable funds for the club.

We also hire out the clubhouse and bar for private hire events such as birthday parties.

Keeping abreast of events

We use Pitchero for most of our club communications and fixture management. You should have signed up to the club already through Pitchero, we strongly recommend that you use the smartphone App, and allow it to post notifications to your phone, and also to your email.

Availability and selection for matches

The selection process is covered in detail in [Senior and Women's Team Selection Policy](#). Here is a brief summary of your part in the process.

In Pitchero, you can see a full schedule of any teams that you are signed up to play for. We ask that you post your availability as follows.

- Keep an initial indication of your availability up-to-date for the next 3 weeks. We won't hold you to this, but it helps us to identify potential problem weekends, for example when many people are on holiday at the same time.
- Update your availability for the following weekend by the Sunday evening before.
- Keep an eye on selection notifications - when you see you have been selected for a team, respond - hopefully positively - immediately.

Communications

There are four sources of day-to-day information about Carlton.

- Pitchero. Information about Carlton, including details of matches, changes to training schedules, news of social events, is sent through Pitchero.
- WhatsApp. Each team has a WhatsApp group, intended for discussing game plans, late notices about matches, arranging lift-sharing to matches, and general team chat. There is also a combined "Players" group for chat relevant to all teams. Contact your

team captain (below) to make sure you are included in the correct WhatsApp group(s).

- Twitter. News and late-breaking announcements are posted on [Twitter @CarltonCricket \(twitter.com/CarltonCricket\)](https://twitter.com/CarltonCricket). We recommend following that feed.
- Website. Regular news reports are published on <https://carltoncc.co.uk/>

Who should I ask ...

In the first instance, ask your team captain. You can contact them through Pitchero's "Messages" feature, although you will probably quickly discover their phone numbers.

Other information

Membership Subs

Membership subs for 2023 are as follows.

- Senior players: £260
- Student players (in full-time education or training): £160
- Women: £135

Senior players who play fewer than 6 league games in a season can apply for a refund of £95 at the end of the season.

Students who are at university outside Edinburgh can ask for pro-rated subs to cover the period of the summer during which they are in Edinburgh.

Very occasional players - players who play no more than 3 or 4 games in a season, and who do not attend training sessions, can opt to pay a match fee of £20 per match in lieu of subs.

To qualify for this, you must be one of:

- Parent of a junior player
- Non-playing members of the club (see <https://carltoncc.co.uk/club/membership/> for details of non-playing memberships).

Subs can be paid in one lump sum, or monthly over a period (usually 3 or 4 months).

Clothing and kit

Everyone should be wearing official team clothing for match days, and we would love everyone to be wearing the club badge at training.

There are three strips.

Kit	Description	Used by
Playing blues	Sky blue shirts with dark blue trousers	1st XI, both Women's teams
Playing whites	Whites	2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th XIs
Training blues	Dark blue shirts with dark blue trousers	Worn for training. Also, most friendly games are played wearing this.

Playing blues can be acquired (if appropriate) through your team captain.
