ARUN REFLECTS ON HIS SPELL AS CAPTAIN

As we stand on the cusp of the 2025 season, I find myself reflecting on the past two years, 2023 and 2024, as captain of Carlton Cricket Club. It has been an incredible honor to lead this team, and as I step aside to hand over the captaincy to Dan Da Costa, I wanted to take a moment to look back on the journey we've shared—the highs, the challenges, and the memories we've created together.

When I was appointed captain in 2023, I felt a deep sense of pride and responsibility. Having debuted for Carlton in 2016 under Stevie Gilmour, taking on the same role he once held was a special moment. I had previously served as vice-captain in 2018 and 2019 under Alasdair Evans, and I was eager to build on the club's legacy of strong leadership. My goal was to blend the experience of our seasoned players with the energy of our younger talent, setting the tone for a competitive season.

The 2023 Eastern Premier League season saw us finish in a solid 4th place with 10 wins from 15 matches. We battled through tough moments, showing the grit and determination I wanted to instill in the team. The season also brought success in the ESCA T20 finals, earning us a spot in the National T20 Finals—a proud achievement for the team. However, the Scottish Cup ended in disappointment as we were knocked out in the quarter-finals.

The 2024 season brought its own set of challenges and triumphs. We started strongly with a series of early wins, and by the halfway stage, we were sitting 2nd in the Eastern Premier League table, showcasing our potential to challenge for the title. However, a tough mid-season period tested our resolve, and we ultimately finished 6th with 9 wins from 16 matches. While this wasn't the result we hoped for, the team bounced back with strong performances later in the campaign, reflecting the resilience I sought to build.

In the Masterton finals, we progressed unbeaten through the early stages but fell short in the final against Grange. The Scottish Cup once again saw us exit in the quarter-finals, this time against Heriot's, who proved a challenging opponent throughout the season.



Leading Carlton over these two years has been a privilege. From the outset, I wanted to build a team defined by resilience, and I'm proud to see how we challenges—mid-season struggles in injuries in 2023, and tough cup exits both years—without losing our determination to keep pushing forward. I'm especially grateful for the on-field support from Dan Da Costa, Umair Mohammad (my vice-captain in 2023), and Chris McBride, whose contributions were invaluable in navigating the ups and downs of these seasons. Beyond cricket, I'll also look back fondly on the sense of camaraderie within the team, which made every moment on this journey even more meaningful. The emergence of young talents and the support of our experienced players have laid a strong foundation for the future.

I owe a big thanks to Stevie Gilmour, our Director of Cricket, and Dewald Nel, our Head Coach, for their unwavering faith and support in me throughout my tenure. Their guidance has been instrumental in shaping my time as captain. As we prepare for the 2025 season, I'm confident that Carlton Cricket Club is in a great position to build on these experiences.

I'm delighted to pass the captaincy to Dan Da Costa, who has been a cornerstone of our team and whose leadership qualities make him the perfect choice to take Carlton forward. I'll continue to contribute as a player, and I'm excited to see what the next chapter holds for our club. To the Arrows, thank you for bearing with me. As we gear up for the new season, let's be ready to "Nock, Draw, and Loose" once more under Dan's leadership.



Cricket Scotland has recently published its ambitious <u>Action Plan</u> for Women and Girls Cricket. There are many issues it must address - the next article by Elsie and Fraser and Keira Ansell illustrates some of the challenges.



Changing the Game: the first girls' cricket club at our school

We are **Keira Ansell** and **Elsie Fraser**, you might know us as we play at Carlton for the girls U16s and women's team, as well as the Eastern Knights team and Scotland U15s team. We are both 14 and have started a girls cricket club at our school (James Gillespies High School). We started the club for our Duke of Edinburgh volunteering and to give state school girls, like us, the opportunity to play cricket. As frequent cricketers we wanted cricket available at our school.

The main reason for the club was to get some volunteering, but the idea had been around for a while anyway, so we asked our current active schools coordinator, and he was totally up for the idea!

So the idea became reality.

Over the next few weeks the three of us had some lunchtime meetings. We planned lessons, filled out forms for the school, and decided to make it a S1 girls cricket club. After the October break (2024) we did our first lesson... and had two people turn up. However, each week the numbers increased as they invited their friends along and we ended up with 10 girls by Christmas!

Sadly, in early December our active schools coordinator, Eliot Ambrose (a former Carlton 5's player), announced he was leaving. At the time it didn't occur to us that our cricket club wouldn't continue without him. When we came back after the Christmas holiday and tried to run the club as normal, without an assigned adult, we were unable to continue.





But that didn't stop us.

To try and get it running again, we contacted people we knew from Cricket Scotland and Carlton CC. We asked them if there was anything they could think of or do to keep our club going, at least until a new active schools coordinator assigned. At first was contacted Sriram Muramalla at Cricket Scotland who we knew from the MCC hub, as well as Euan Sweet from Carlton. They both kindly did some asking around for us but unfortunately, neither of them could find a solution. However they did give us some ideas and encouraged us to keep trying.

So we kept trying.

In the meantime, to keep up our Duke of Edinburgh evidence, we asked Stevie if we could volunteer at the Carlton P2 and P3's session with Rudy, which he kindly agreed to. Stevie later came up with the idea that someone like Rudy could be the supervisor for our cricket club. When he confirmed that Rudy was actually available it meant all we had left to do was to sell the idea to the school.

After the February break we could start again!

With the support of those who have helped us, we overcame some challenges and successfully started, grew, and restarted the first girls cricket club at our school. Now that our club is in action again, once we have an active schools coordinator, we hope to expand and start coaching in local primary schools to make cricket a more accessible sport for girls.

What a great story - well done airls!

Anyone in those roles who doesn't already have Protection of Vulnerable Groups (PVG) membership for Carlton, will have recently received a request via Pitchero to complete a self-declaration form as part of the process of applying for PVG scheme membership.

Please complete the form and return it to mary.rose1008@gmail.com as quickly as possible. Membership of the Scheme is now a legal requirement for everybody working or volunteering with children and young people aged under 18 years.

Failure to secure membership will mean you cannot undertake those roles and this may in turn imperil the range of activities we can offer our young cricketers.

As a Club with a large and dynamic junior section Carlton takes all aspects of child safety and welfare extremely seriously.

SCOTTISH CRICKET REGISTRATION SYSTEM

This season, all cricket players in Scotland need to register with the Scottish Cricket Registration System (SCRS).

Cricket Scotland have introduced SCRS to hold a database of all cricket players in Scotland. They need this for two main reasons:

- it is required by the ICC and Sport Scotland the two major sources of funding to CS
- they need to know about the cricketing population so they can more effectively allocate resources across the game.

As one of Scotland's largest clubs, Carlton should support CS in creating this database. It is for each player, senior and junior, to register - the club cannot do it for you.



Ollie was among the leading wicket takers in the tournament, and bagged the event's only 5fer when he took 5-25 against Europe.



HISTORY CORNER - 1935




Shown above is Carlton's fixture list for the 1935 season as published in Rowan's Cricket Guide.

For the 1935 season, NL Stevenson resumed the captaincy (at the tender age of 60) a position he would retain until 1947. That season he took 34 wickets at an average of 7.4, winning the best bowler award - a prize he had won for the first time in 1896. In all he won it 26 times.

Out of 26 matches played that season, 14 were won, 9 drawn and 3 lost. A 9 wicket victory against Edinburgh Accies was particularly pleasing, as the Accies had been unbeaten until that point being generally regarded as the best side in the east.

Six clubs represented in that fixture list no longer exist.





Rowan's Cricket Guide was published annually during the first half of the 20th Century. Rowan & Co was a Clothing Store in Glasgow, known also for their sportswear. The illustration shows their A-Listed Buchanan Street premises, still called Rown House and now occupied by Laings the Jeweller.

Rowans was taken over by Austin Reed in 1974 and ceased trading in 1981.

In 1924 Rowan's inaugurated the West of Scotland Charity Cup, now known as the Rowan Cup which is still the premier T20 competition in the District. Its winner takes part in the National T20 Finals.

A similar cricket guide was published annually by RW Forsyth who had premises in Princes Street.

45* - CONGRATULATIONS BILL

Carlton is pleased to note the honour given to Bill Polson at the recent AGM of The East of Scotland Cricket Association (ESCA).

Cricket Scotland CEO Trudy Lindblade was on hand to surprise Bill with a commemorative quaich to mark 45 years of involvement with cricket administration in the region. Bill received a standing ovation from those present as he received his award, remarking that he was "surprised, delighted, and looking forward to a busy and sunny summer."

Bill joined the ESCA Committee in 1979 as a divisional representative. In 1983 he became Secretary, holding the role until 1986 and was then an ordinary Committee member. Bill became youth convenor in 1994 and held that role until 2015 (making contact with many Carlton juniors as they came through the ranks). He served as President between 1997 and 1999.



Although more noted for his long association with Edinburgh South CC (formerly Mitre) Bill is an old friend of Carlton. In <u>Newsletter 30</u> (January 2021) Bill recalled his first visit to Grange Loan on a Sunday afternoon walk with his parents in 1948 and many subsequent afternoons spectating and scoring.

He still can be found at the scorer's table for one of Edinburgh South's XIs and is keenly anticipating his club's first appearance in the Premiership - they visit Grange Loan on 23 August. Read a fuller account of his cricketing career in this article in the Jaffa.

Bill played as a guest in the Veteran's match commemorating Carlton's 150th year in 2013 and can be seen below waiting to pounce in the field.



Sparked by the inquiry a couple of issues ago as to whether any Carlton player was born on Christmas Day, Martin Firth investigated what Carlton's Pitchero birthday data reveals

This search includes the 249 players who played at least one game (Junior or Senior) at the club last year, and who have entered a valid date of birth in Pitchero. It omits parents, juniors who didn't play a game, ex-players and others who may also be in Pitchero.

As was previously revealed, no Carlton player has a birthday on Christmas Day. There is one birthday on Boxing Day, but none on Christmas Eve.

Players were born on 180 of the 366 days in the year. There are two birthdays on 1 Jan, but none on Valentine's Day or 29 Feb.

There are 5 birthdays in the second half of April, so they might be getting the start of the cricket season as a birthday present.

There are no birthdays on 31 August, but given the way age groups are determined, the one junior born on 30 August will forever be the youngest player in their team. Conversely, there is one junior who hung on to 1 September who will forever be the oldest player in their team.

There are no birthdays on Halloween or Guy Fawkes Night. There is one birthday on St Andrew's Day.


There are three sets of twins at the club at the moment, although there are at least three other players who are twins whose twin played cricket with them in the past. There is also one pair of unrelated 'twins'. There are 42 days on which two players have birthdays, eight with three birthdays, and four with four birthdays: 16 Jan, 21 Feb, 12 Sep & 4 Nov.


Thursday is the most popular day for Carlton players to be born (18.5%), Friday is the least popular, (12%). Surprisingly, the 31st is not the least popular day of the month; the 5th is, with only 3 birthdays. The 31st is second bottom, tied with the 23rd, with 4 birthdays. The 12th is the most popular day with 13 birthdays. I was delighted to find that the 9th has 9 birthdays.

Here are a couple of charts which might amuse.


The chart on the left accidentally illustrates that data analysis is only as good as the input data. You'd be surprised how many people can't enter their or their children's birthday correctly! For example, one player in the 70-80 range has got their own birthday spectacularly wrong (they're really 40-50).

The other chart showing month of birth is intrigueing: there is a well-documented correlation between sporting success and autumn birthdays (generally assumed to be because of the arbitrary 1 September cut-off for junior sports), but I hadn't expected that split to be quite so obvious in Carlton's age distribution.





Birthday month




